Each Summer WMS sponsors a Summer Reading Program for all students entering grades 6-8. The goals of the program are to foster a love of reading, to promote independent reading and to ensure that your child's reading skills are maintained at their current level. This summer reading program is optional but strongly supported by our administration and teachers.

WHAT TO DO:

To participate in the Summer Reading Program, we require all students to **read a minimum of three books: two fiction books and one nonfiction book**. Fiction books must have at least 80 pages, and the nonfiction book must have at least 20 pages. Over 250 nonfiction eBooks are available for students this year. (See the directions to access Walton Middle School eBooks on the following page.) A list of recommended titles, authors, and series is attached. The attached list should be used as a guide to assist you in finding books. You may read books, authors and series not on the list.

To complete the Summer Reading Program students will turn in their **Student Reading Record Log and one completed Reading Record for each of the three books they have read by Monday, August 27th to the Media Center**. 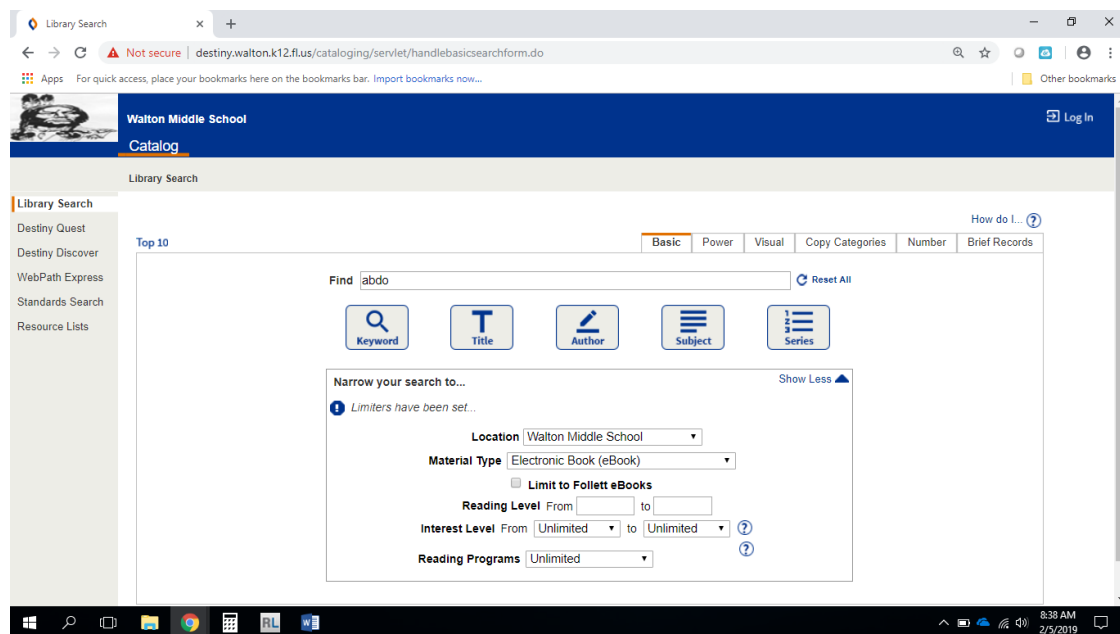

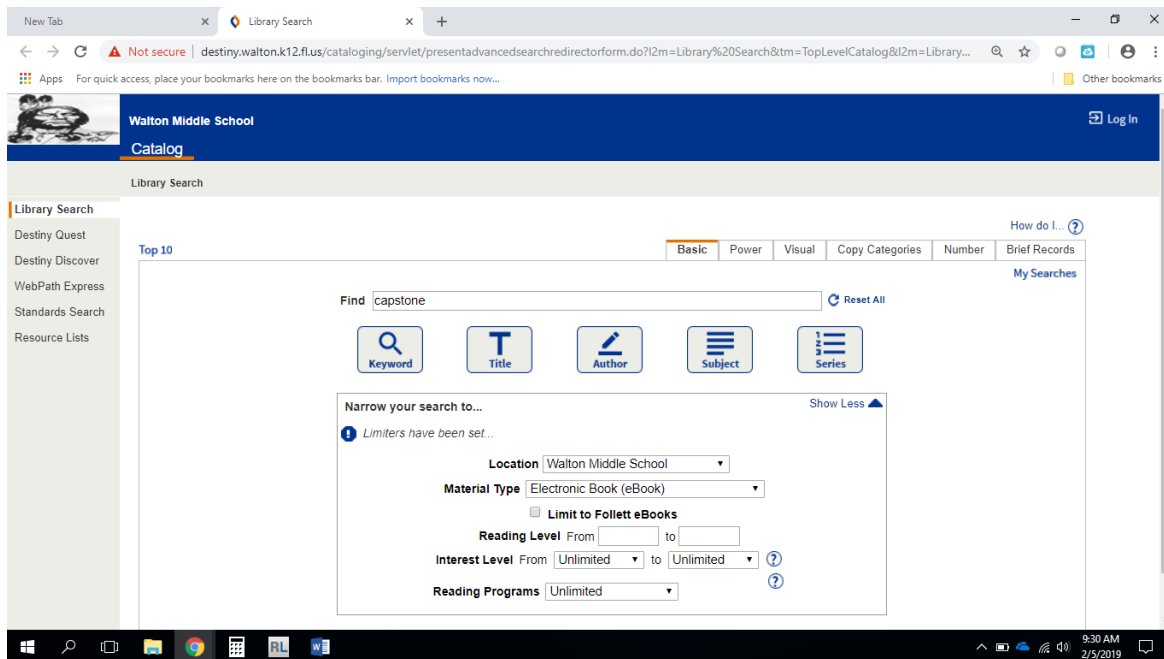
